





5th & 6th Grade Social Studies



This week, 5th and 6th grade Social Studies students began an educational program run by the School of Economics, which culminates in a field trip on February 6th. The School of Economics in Blue Springs, Missouri is a nonprofit educational program that provides students with a hands-on learning experience focused on economics and financial literacy. It serves students by extending classroom learning into an interactive environment where students learn by doing.

During our visit to the School of Economics, students will participate in a simulated marketplace where they take on jobs, earn income, pay expenses, and make financial decisions. Through these activities, students learn important concepts such as supply and demand, budgeting, saving, and entrepreneurship. The program also emphasizes teamwork, responsibility, and problem-solving as students work together and interact as consumers and business owners.

This engaging experience helps students connect social studies and economics concepts to real-life situations, making learning meaningful and memorable. Many Bishop Hogan students find the program to be a highlight of their school year, as it builds confidence and practical life skills while reinforcing key academic standards taught in 5th and 6th grade social studies classes.
