I want to take this opportunity to thank the young men from Bishop Hogan who were servers at church for Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday services. They gave their best to honor God and they did such a nice job!

April 8 is the date of the Solar Eclipse. It is supposed to last 4 minutes, 28 sec and 90 percent visible here. I have solar safety glasses for students in grades 2-8. Unless we hear from you, we will assume it is ok for your child to go out with safety glasses on. We will be very clear about them NOT taking them off until they go inside.

Our midterm is next Friday, April 12. Iowa Assessment, our annual standardized testing will be held the week of April 15-19. Please try to avoid scheduling any appointments in the mornings of that week if possible, so we don't have make-up tests. Students in grades 3-8 will be tested in Science, Social Studies, Reading and Math. The following week, April 23-25, students will take the CoGat, a much shorter test that measures cognitive ability. It's 90 minutes, so we will break it up into 30 minute segments first hour on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday.

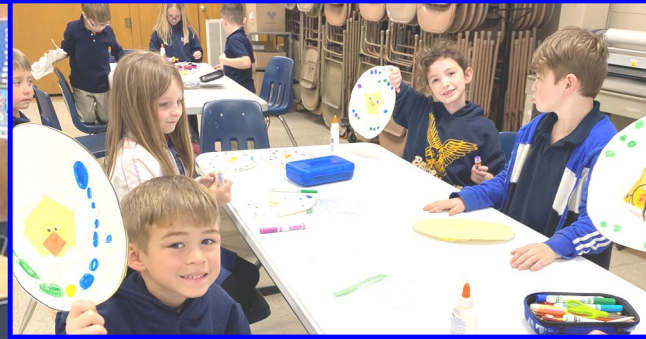

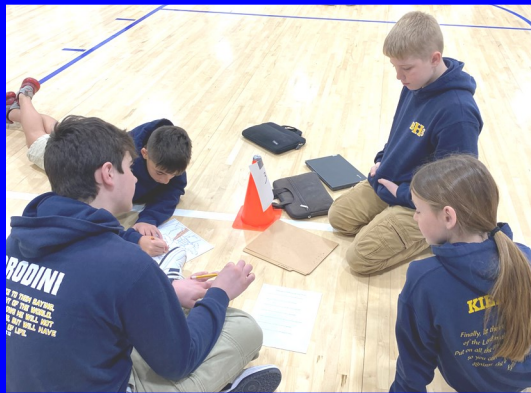

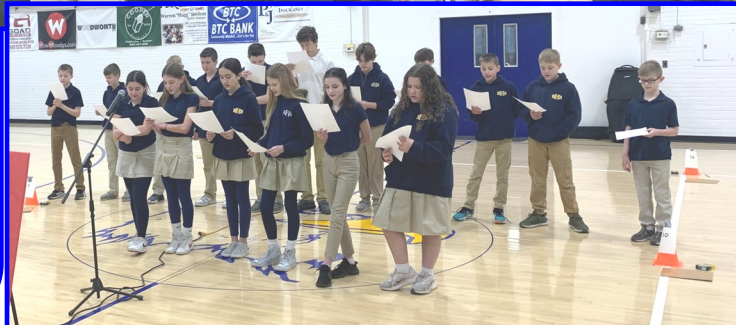
